

MODERATOR'S VOICE – MAY 2022

Once again we find ourselves, at St Columba, in a vacancy situation. Some will be disappointed that Alec and Amy didn't choose to seek reappointment at the end of Alec's one year Parish Supply appointment. However, this didn't happen, and we wish them well as they return to Australia where Alec has taken up his new position.

Our faith journey will also continue here at St Columba and we can be confident that Christ, the King and Head of our Church has good things in store for us.

You will see more of me in my role as Interim Moderator, over the next few months, as I take up more responsibility for the Sunday worship. I want to talk about 'the faith we share' and how that impacts what we do together in our Church fellowship and worship.

In instructing his disciples Jesus said, "I will build my Church and nothing, not even the gates of hell will prevail against it." He also said, "Follow me." These two statements go together. We can't call ourselves a follower of Jesus and be uncommitted to the Church.

What did Jesus come to do? Paul says it best, 'God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself.' And the Church remains at the centre of his plan. It is to the Christian Church alone that Christ has entrusted the message of reconciliation.

So, what does church membership mean for us? May I suggest it includes three essential steps.

Step 1: Choosing to Belong. The most basic level of response to the Gospel after committing ourselves to God is to find a church family and say – "*This is going to be my family – my spiritual home. I'm going to get connected and put down some roots because this is God's purpose for me.*" Believing and belonging go together.

"You are members of God's very own family...and **you belong** in God's household with every other Christian." Eph. 2:19 LB

Step 2: Learning to Share. Friendship is very important to God. *"All believers met together constantly and shared everything with each other."* Acts 2:44 LB

Meeting together and sharing are the foundation for strong relationships and enduring friendships.

a. We are to share our experiences. *"People learn from one another just as iron sharpens iron."* Prov. 27:17 TEV

b. We are encouraged to share our homes. *"Open your homes to each other."* 1 Peter 4:9 NCV **c. We are to share our problems.** Gal. 6: 2 *"Share each other's troubles and problems."*

Step 3: 'Playing my Part'. God did not bring us to faith and to His Church just to be spectators. In any family there are costs to be met and chores to be done – don't leave it to the few faithful. It is a huge privilege to be a part of what God is doing, but we can only be a part if we cooperate and participate with Christ our Head. There is no place for individualism in the Body of Christ because it's not as individuals, but it's when we work together, that God can make a difference through our efforts.

I hope you can hear something of my passion for the Church. Let's work and pray together to make St Columba the best we can be, leaving the results to God.

When we share, a **problem** is **cut** in half and a **joy** is **doubled**. The Bible says we are to, *"Weep with those who weep and rejoice with those who rejoice."*

Paul doesn't say **solve one another's problems** – even God doesn't always choose to do that. But we can lend a sympathetic ear and we can pray for one another and offer care and support beyond words.

Hebrews says, "Let us not give up the **habit of meeting together**. Instead, let us **encourage** one another..." 10:25 TEV

Well, young Shem who at sums was expert, Worked it out on his slate that it came at the rate, Of per gallon, per second, per squirt.


The bloodhound tried hard to keep water in check, By lapping it up with his tongue,

COOK UP A STORM

In 1916 Anzac Day was gazetted as a half day holiday.



In 1921 Anzac Day became a full public holiday.

In 1936 dawn ceremonies were widely included in New Zealand Anzac Day commemorations.

In 1949 legislation was passed preventing Anzac Day from being Mondayised.

In 1966 the current Anzac Day Act allowed activities after 1pm on Anzac Day.

In 2013 The decision was made that when Anzac day 25th April falls on a Saturday or Sunday , the Monday following will be a public holiday.

In 2020 all Anzac Day public ceremonies in New Zealand were cancelled because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
